### 4. FIRST AID MEASURES

<b>Inhalation:</b>	Move to fresh air. If not breathing, give artificial respiration. If breathing is difficult, give oxygen. Get medical attention.

### 6. ACCIDENTAL RELEASE MEASURES

## 7. HANDLING AND STORAGE

**Handling:**

Keep in a cool, well ventilated area away from heat, sparks and open flame. Keep container tightly closed until ready for use. For safe storage, store at or above 0 °C (32°F)
